Community meeting

Wednesday 5 October, 6pm, Hall. The Mayor, Deputy Mayor and senior Council staff will address concerns of Michelago residents and be available to chat.



Micalago Road issue – update from SMRC Councillor Higgins



On 14 August I was alerted to a number of trucks which were dumping material into the disused iron ore mine pits on Micalago Road. Residents knew nothing about this development, so I immediately contacted Council's General Manager to investigate the situation. It was revealed that it was a legal operation with an approved Development Application, which allowed unrestricted truck movements along the unsealed road 11 hours per day, six days per week!



The activity is actually compliant under the current Land and Environment Plan. However, my questions, along with those of everyone else, were:

- Why were residents not notified as part of the DA assessment?
- How do we know what is being put in the ground is safe?
- How is the impact of all of those trucks on the road going to be managed?

Further issues arose:

- The alleged dangerous and disrespectful behaviour of the truck drivers, impacting on the health and safety of Micalago Road residents
- Questions about compliance with Council consent orders, road laws, Worksafe and EPA regulations.

I would like to thank everyone who contacted me, kept me informed of the situation and sent in photos.

Outcomes to date:

- Confirmed that only Virgin Excavated Natural Material (VENM) is allowed to be used.
- Council has reviewed its processes and found that the Community Consultation Plan (the guiding document as to what activity triggers notifying residents) may need updating to ensure that this doesn't happen again.
- Senior Council staff negotiated new operating hours with the applicant, which are now 8am to 5pm Monday to Friday.
- Council's compliance team make regular and random site visits to assess level of compliance and soil testing.
- Council has been working with other agencies to check truck compliance and the EPA to ensure the soil is not contaminated.

- Any damage to the road caused by the trucks has to be fixed throughout the project.
- Council has restricted the road speed limits to 50km/h to the quarry site, and Cooma Police have been requested to patrol.
- Residents will be notified of any further DA modifications going forward.

Seed Savers and Growers Group

Our seed savers and growers group had the Growing Veggies from Seed workshop on Sunday 28 August at the railway station

We had about 12 people come along to learn about growing vegetables from seed and we all took away some transplanted seedlings and seeds to grow at home.

It was presented by Arian from Canberra Seed Savers, who are supporting our local group to get up and running.



Some of the top take-away tips:

- Plant your seeds about twice the depth of the width of the seed, in a container for transplanting to the garden or a bigger container later.
- Water from the top lightly to start with and then when the seeds start to sprout and grow they will prefer their water from the bottom.
- A sprinkling of sand is great to go over the top of small seeds like tomatoes, carrots, lettuce, etc.
- Plant more than you think you need and more often than you think is necessary. If you're super successful, you can always share, swap, sell your seedlings off:)



Our September Seed Savers and Growers group get-together will be at Lyn's house in Bredbo on Sunday 25 September 2–4pm.

We're going to do a tour of her fantastic gardens and learn lots of great gardening tips from Lyn, who is a very experienced gardener. Please contact Belinda on 0411 043 027 or hello@michelagoyoga.com.au for details if you'd like to come along.

Michelago Memorial Hall acoustics

There have been complaints for many years about the poor acoustics of the Hall. People have been able to hear speakers satisfactorily only when a microphone is used or when the building is quite full with people.

The hall now has an excellent AV system with a projector, screen and speakers, purchased with a Council grant some years ago and recently made fully operational. It would be great for community



movie nights if the sound didn't bounce all over the place!

For an initial acoustics strategy, the Hall Committee is considering quotes for wider, thicker curtains.

These would also improve the aesthetics of the building.



Cold Country Koala Project

This is an opportunity to be involved in koala surveys and property improvement.



The official Area of Regional Koala Significance (ARKS) for our region stretches across and along the Tinderry range, from the Tinderry Nature Reserve right down to Numeralla and beyond. You can see the map at:

Although the map doesn't appear to include Michelago, the government-defined region has fairly meaningless borders. This specific project is for 'the ARKS and surrounding areas'.

It includes activities near the Snowy Mountains, and koalas have been seen on the far side of the highway, so definitely Michelago is in scope. Note that the form itself is not a survey but a landholder expression of interest to participate.

That could be in co-funding restoration/improvement/protection works, or being open to audio-surveys (and other surveys, like drones and scat-dogs?) on suitable properties.

Given koalas have been seen even at the Bredbo pub (outside only!) as well as Googong and close to Queanbeyan, they clearly roam quite widely beyond the ARKS.

It's very hard to spot koalas with the unaided eye, but their distinctive calls travel a long distance, and that's why the <u>audio surveys</u> are proving very useful.

From September 2022 the four ratings will be:


Moderate: plan and prepare

High: be ready to act

Extreme: take action now to protect life and property: Catastrophic: for your survival, leave bushfire risk areas.

Chilean Needle Grass is likely to be the next big weed on the Monaro. Everyone who manages land is urged to become familiar with what it looks like and the risks involved if it gets established.

More information on its impacts can be found here (Also look at this for the NZ experience and here for the current published distribution). Council's current advice is also attached.

At these drop-in sessions, Council's Biosecurity staff will be available to show people what it looks like and how it differs from look-alikes (e.g. phalaris). Seeing it for yourself, and spending 10-20 minutes being shown how to pick it out, is by far the best way to learn how to spot it.

In a few weeks' time when things have greened up, it will become more difficult to pick out. So now is an excellent time to get your 'eye in'.


