The bridge - excellent news

The bridge really is coming! A media release from Snowy Monaro Regional Council, 22 November, and forwarded by Di to all residents on the MRCA email list, includes:

In the quarterly budget review statement tabled at the November Ordinary Meeting of Snowy Monaro Regional Council, Councillors approved substantial funding for a wide range of important infrastructure upgrades and maintenance projects across the region.

\$916,800 has been committed for the eagerly awaited bridge over the Michelago Causeway, a major construction project for the northern part of the region connecting the two sides of the village and creating a local traffic alternative to the Monaro Highway.'

Huge thanks again to local Councillor John Rooney, who initiated Council action on the bridge and has kept up pressure against resistance to make the bridge happen. Thank you also to the Council members and staff who supported this vital project.

Eleven years ago, Kerry and I designed and built a passive solar home on a corner of her family farm near Michelago. Like so many other rural properties in the northeastern Monaro, it is a place of breathtaking natural beauty. It's so beautiful, in fact, Council wanted to rezone our land E3. But with the help of the Tinderry Mountain and Smiths Road

I have a great affection for the village of Michelago. I love its rural charm and friendly atmosphere. I am pleased with the Michelago Masterplan that I initiated while Mayor and guided as a Councillor. It will preserve and enhance the character of Michelago that we value so highly.

Michelago has great community spirit and I am proud to play my part in its civic ceremonies such as Remembrance Day.

I admire our Firies. Like everyone, I was hugely impressed and grateful for the dedicated service of Brent Wallis, Captain of the Michelago Brigade and his crews during the black summer emergency. As a Councillor, I help them

whenever I can. For the Michelago Brigade I have delivered land for their new fire

shed; compensation for their old shed. Also, we will build a bridge over Michelago Creek (construction will start early next year) to shorten their response time. In Dec 2020, I was honoured to represent the Deputy Premier at the Colinton Brigade to present awards to the Brigade Captain Graham Povey and other members for their outstanding service.





I enjoy meeting people and discussing their issues. These charming ladies having a coffee at the Michelago General Store are all community leaders: Karen Porter President of the Bredbo Progress Association; Di Fett President of the Michelago Region Community Association and Paula Mance, Secretary of the Smiths Road Community Group. who to call when something needs fixing. We have addressed teething problems with the Bank of Bins. They are now emptied more often and each has an odour eater. The Bin shed has a new collection point for batteries and fluorescent light bulbs. Try it sometime. It's a safer way to dispose of these toxic items.



If there is one thing I do not like about rural Monaro, it's the potholes. I work with Council to repair the most degraded stretches of road as required grades and even scaling for the worst.

I am committed to responsible financial management of Council and will continue to oppose frivolous expenditure and to support efficiency reforms. However, I do not want to balance the budget at the cost of services for Michelago and the northeastern Monaro because they have been historically neglected by successive Councils.

I am an economist with degrees from Sydney University and the ANU. For 33 years I worked in many government departments on issues relevant to our local council: small business, regional development, transport, energy and climate change. I have financial training and experience. I have led a budget team and introduced efficiency reforms such as Activity Based Costing and Process Mapping into a department with over a thousand staff.
