Micalago Road Update

following my meeting with Micalago Road residents on Saturday 8 May, I had discussions with Council's road staff about the poor condition of the gravel roads around Michelago. After an inspection of local conditions, Council staff have reexamined their maintenance schedule and found some money for additional works. Today I received the following good news from Council's Chief Operating Officer:

Good afternoon Clr Rooney,

I can advise that both Micalago & Burra roads have deteriorated with recent rain and were not programmed for scheduled maintenance at this time. However due to the deterioration, we have now allocated a budget for both roads from Council capital local gravel re-sheeting budget current financial year to address the most impacted sections. Locations of work have been identified and we are proceeding to engage a contractor to ensure the work is completed this month. Both re-sheeting and grading will be included in the scope of works.

Hopefully we will see the worst affected stretches of Micalago Road and Burra Road repaired in June. This should give some relief to residents who have been struggling with the poor conditions. Please be patient with the Council road crews when they are working. Some delays are inevitable but the results will be worth it.



Why is it called the "Message Stick"?

other tribes, even when entering 'enemy territory'. When someone carrying a message stick entered another group's country, they announced themselves with smoke signals and were then accompanied safely with the message stick to the elders so that they may speak their verbal message. The messenger would then be accompanied back to the border with a reply to pass back to their tribe. The messages transmitted by these message sticks included announcements of ceremonies, invitations to corroborees, notices, requests, disputes, warnings, meetings, marriage arrangements, notification of a family member passing, requests for objects, and trade negotiations. Remarkably, the message contained in these tools of communication could be understood by Aboriginals from many different regions of Australia, despite the fact that they had different languages and dialects" (www.ancient-origins.net). We chose this name for the symbology of inclusivity, understanding and respect for all members of our community.

In the spirit of reconciliation and our community interacting and living in harmony with each other, I would like to acknowledge the Ngarigo people, the Traditional Custodians of this region and their connections to land, sea and community. We pay our respects to elders past and present and extend this respect to all Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples today.
