Farewell but not forgotten

Gill and Tony Robinson, such mainstays of the Michelago community, have moved on to be close to family and are now enjoying life near their grandchildren. Both worked tirelessly for Michelago, including running the MRCA as President and Treasurer respectively, Landcare as Chair and Treasurer respectively, as firefighters on the ground, Gill as a radio controller at Cooma Fire Control and both holding various offices in the Colinton Fire Brigade — that is, always ready to hold a hose. Tony also served as President of Upper Murrumbidgee Landcare for several years, and Tony and Gill have been an integral part of UMLC. They will be deeply missed. Huge thanks to Gill and Tony for everything they have done for our community. We weren't able to hold the planned farewell, but they've promised not to be strangers to Michelago, and we will celebrate with them when we can.

Vale to a pillar of our community, Vernon Drew, who passed away last week. Vern made valuable contributions to the Michelago community in many roles. He was a long-term member of the MRCA, as well as of the Michelago Fire Brigade and a foundation member of Michelago Landcare, and served on Council for many years. Vern and Sue moved into town a few years ago, but never really left our community. We will miss his good humour, readiness for a yarn and wealth of knowledge about all things Michelago. Our love and condolences to Sue, Sophie, Scott and Michael.

Vale also to Dick Lawler, who passed away on Monday, 11 October, aged 82, after a short illness. He was a Michelago boy brought up on the family property, 'Hilldyke' and attended the local school on horseback, as many did in those days. Here are some memories from those who got to know him more recently. Landcare members will especially remember his dry wit, acute observations, help to country newbies, and willingness to pitch in and work on environmental projects. After such work, he and Gay sometimes held barbecues at their weekender, a delightfully restored heritage cottage by the river, where Dick had done skilful stonework, tended his beloved vegetable patch and helped maintain Gay's stunningly beautiful flower garden. He talked little about his early days, yet loved socialising and had many mates in Canberra and beyond with whom he liked to share a meal and drink (like the legendary 'Sir Lunchalot') and, always, jokes. He was genuinely interested in other people's stories, especially those of the friends and family of his near neighbours. He shared his love of old, classic cars with Gay and loved touring heritage houses and gardens with her. In short, Dick was a really good bloke.

Michelago Landcare Important News

There is a changing of the guard at the Michelago and District Landcare Group. After nearly twenty years in the roles, Tony Robinson, the Chairperson, and Gill Robinson, the Treasurer, are moving away from our area, and will be greatly missed. The committee welcomed Markus Buchhorn and Belinda Sierzchula to take over for them in these roles, and noted that the group will particularly



appreciate having younger people in leadership roles to further refresh the group.

Our Landcare group has run well over 15 major projects: tree planting, water management, weed removal and pest control, supporting pollinators and various endangered wildlife species, increasing regenerative farming practices and connected landscapes, and supporting emerging carbon management and soil improvement programs. It has also operated a huge number of community events since it started, around 1999, and is keen to grow participation even further, across all age groups.

Landcare is a great way to meet other locals, share ideas, learn a lot and make new friends, at the same time as seeing your collective efforts achieve environmental benefits for our beautiful Michelago region.

There are frequently a large number of opportunities available to landholders in our region, with opportunities around river restoration, weed control, fencing, erosion control and massive tree-planting already on the table, and just recently around 11 landholders have volunteered to host major tree-planting activities in 2022 subsidised by a significant grant. The group is also keen to share knowledge about the use of technology, including wildlife cameras and drones and sensors, to help care for our land and its inhabitants, and to run more workshops and on-property

COUNCIL MATTERS from Councillor John Rooney:

- Micalago Road and Burra Road will be graded and re-sheeted with 500 tons of gravel each.
- Tinderry Road will be sealed for 3 kilometres in total:
 - Remedial work is continuing on the recently sealed section around 'The Governor'.
 - o Further stretches of the hill climb up the mountain will be sealed.
 - A section from the Burra Road turnoff to the timber yards will be sealed to cope with heavy firewood trucks
- The old fire shed has been converted into a Bank of Bins for use by participating rural residents:
 - o You may apply through forms available at the Michelago General Store.
 - The cost will be \$250 a year (\$5 a week). The charge will be added to the rates notice only of those who sign up.
 - Access is via a keycode on the door that will be issued to you upon application.
 - If you have any feedback on the bank of bins or find the bins need servicing, etc please email council@snowymonaro.nsw.gov.au.
