Constables Column

Traffic issues head the column once again. Since the newsletter there have been 3 motor vehicle collisions on the highway north of Michelago near Kelly Road, a vehicle caught in rapidly rising flood waters on the Burra Road north of Michelago. It appears the message does not seem to be getting through to some drivers in our local area when a male driver was earlier this month on the highway speeding. The driver was stopped and breath tested and was subsequently arrested and charged with Low Range drink driving and the speeding offence. The driver will be attending court in the new year.

During the early hours of the 2nd October an 18 year old female was allegedly abducted in Canberra by her ex-partner and driven to the Monaro Highway north of Michelago. She was then sexually assaulted at knife point before being stabbed in the neck and left at the scene while the offender drove back into Canberra. Even though the female was suffering from serious injuries she managed to flag down a passing motorist who contacted police. Police and ambulance officers attended and provided first aid to the female who was conveyed to the Canberra Hospital and underwent emergency surgery. The offender was arrested later in the day and was refused bail at Queanbeyan Court. He is due back in court early in the new year. The female has been released from hospital and is recovering well. If there are any witnesses that have not yet spoken to police please make contact utilising the phone numbers at the end of the column.

Cooma-Monaro, Palerang, Queanbeyan councils and ACT Roads have advised me of a number of roads closed or access restricted as a result of the recent heavy rain/floods. The roads affected include the Burra Road, Tinderry Road, Smiths Road, Angle Crossing Road and Jerangle Road. Please abide by the relevant signs and speak to the applicable councils for more information.

An issue of concern recently has been instances of domestic dogs attacking sheep and other animals. A Burra resident witnessed three sheep getting attacked by a neighbours dog. The dog was shot and killed by the sheep owner. The sheep also died from their injuries. Subsequent action was taken against the dog owner which resulted in a hefty compensation bill. Closer to Michelago a Tinderry road resident had a number of sheep mauled by a dog. The sheep suffered severe trauma from the injuries with many having to be euthanised by the owner. If anyone sights dogs in public areas ie. walking along roads without an owner present contact the council rangers and they will attend and seize the dog and issue the owner hefty

finer or court action. Remember the owner of any animal is responsible for any damage/injuries it causes if not supervised.

I want to again re-inforce being vigilant about property security after a Tinderry Road resident recently had items stolen from a car parked in the driveway during the night. With the holiday season here make sure you secure your property and let your neighbours and/or a friend know so they can watch out and check on the property whilst it is vacant. I have received a small number of rural crime assessment packs as mentioned in the last newsletter. I will leave these packs at the shop and hopefully can obtain more in the new year.

As I have mentioned in previous reports a state-wide audit of firearms and firearm storage safes continues and will do so throughout next year. Please ensure all details are correct and if changes need to be made or for general firearms enquiries please contact the Firearms Registry on 1300 362 562.

Remember the contact details for police are emergency 000, non emergency 02 62359131 or to report crime that does not require a police response 131444 (calling from within NSW) or Crime Stoppers to report suspicious activity anonymously on 1800333000. I am happy to speak with anyone about any issues, comments and feedback. I can also be contacted by email on gann1cha@police.nsw.gov.au I check this email on a regular basis even when on leave and will call you back promptly.

A View from Council

I hope you all had a very happy and enjoyable Christmas and New Year break.

I appreciate that I am beginning to sound like a parrot but, believe it or not, Council is making progress with the Local Environment Plan (LEP). For all of you who have been waiting patiently (or impatiently as the case may be) Council hopes to be able to provide some good news in the next few months.

Council has also been conducting workshops on the proposed new Integrated Planning and Reporting Framework. This will replace the current Management Plan and Social Plan (but not until June 2012) and will engage the community in an ongoing consultation and reporting process.

The heavy rains that occurred before Christmas wreaked havoc on many roads, particularly in the north of the shire. Council's resources were stretched, and responses were managed within Council's capabilities. Most of those roads that were closed to through traffic have now been re-opened, although there are still substantial outstanding works to be addressed. Council appreciates residents' patience and understanding through this difficult period whilst repairs are carried out.

2011 Census Recruitment

The next national Census of Population and Housing will be conducted on the night of Tuesday 9 August 2011.

The Census aims to accurately measure the number of people in Australia on Census night, their key characteristics, and the dwellings in which they live.

In order to assist in the preparation and operation of the Census, the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) is recruiting around 43,000 community-minded field staff all over Australia, 10,000 of which will be in NSW and the ACT, to help us count the nation.

Census workers are vital to the success of the Census, and to their communities. We need to count every household correctly to ensure Census data is as accurate and reliable as possible. This data is used by communities, private institutions and all levels of government for planning services and facilities.
